SIXTH CLASS WWI PROJECT



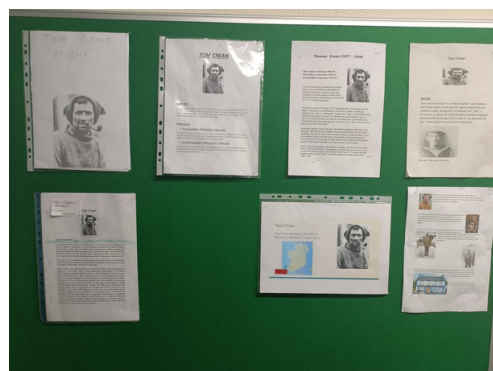
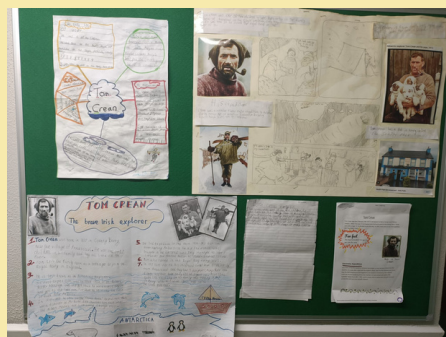
Over the last few weeks, Mr. Corkery's, Mr. Cooper's and Mr. Spellacy's Sixth classes have been busy studying the history and geography of WWI. As part of their studies they created their own shoe-box trenches. Their finished pieces were displayed on the school's corridor for other students and teachers to see. The students were very inventive with their use of everyday household items and products. For example, some students used tea bags for sandbags, lollipop sticks and matchsticks for trench supports and pieces of wire to replicate barbed wire in no-man's land. The projects were accompanied by information about trench warfare in WWI. Great work Sixth class!

MARNOCK'S SWIMMERS MAKE WAVES



On Sunday, January 14th five St. Marnock's students took part in the Leinster Minor Swimming Championships in the National Aquatic Centre in Abbottstown. For some of them it was their first swimming competition but they all performed admirably. All children improved their times and some even qualified for the Irish School's Championship in March. Here is a breakdown of the results:

Filip Bottelier : 4th class, Ms Lalor. He won a bronze medal in the relay.

Kyla Connaughton : 4th class Mr Doherty. She qualified for the Irish Minor Championships in 50m back crawl.

Leon Niemczyk : 5th class Ms Dillon. He got a bronze medal in the boys relay race.

Matteo Scaringella : 5th class, Mr. Maughan. He qualified for the Irish Minor Championship in 50m breaststroke and 100m medley (4 strokes). He got a bronze medal in the 100 IM and in the boys relay.

Tommaso Scaringella : 3rd class, Ms Cullen. He qualified for the Irish Minor Championship in 50 breaststroke and 50 free and he got a bronze medal on the boys relay. At only 8 years old he was the youngest who competed in the relay (11-12 years old).
